## **Help for Haiti Hosts 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Seacoast MobilePack to Benefit Malnourished Children in North Haiti**

*Nonprofit set to surpass 1,000,000 packed meals this year*

**Rye Beach, NH, May 12, 2016** – [Help for Haiti](http://helpforhaiti.org), a New Hampshire-based nonprofit whose mission is to feed, educate and employ communities in north Haiti, will host its 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) MobilePack on Saturday, May 21, at Seacoast Helicopter in Portsmouth, NH. Help for Haiti, in partnership with food supplier and fellow nonprofit, FMSC, is on track to pack their one-millionth meal this year.

Jim Willey, Help for Haiti founder and president, said, “The Annual MobilePack is an integral component of our mission to feed, educate and employ children in Haiti as they transition from childhood to adulthood. You can’t overlook the simple fact that children are unable to grow and mature, physically or mentally, without adequate nutrition. Real change starts with food, and we have five years of success stories to prove it.”

The daylong food-packing event will bring together 600 volunteers to hand-pack over 125,000 FMSC MannaPack™ meals that are specially formulated to provide protein, carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals to severely malnourished children. These meals will then be shipped to north Haiti to provide one meal per day to 480 hungry children in the two schools that Help for Haiti supports.

“You wouldn’t believe the visible change in a child’s attitude, focus and overall demeanor when they have a warm, nutritious meal. It’s amazing to witness how a simple bowl of vitamins and rice can transform a child’s entire future.”
