Help for Haiti Hosts 7th Annual Seacoast MobilePack to Feed Children in North Haiti

Rye Beach, NH, May 24, 2017 – [Help for Haiti](http://www.helpforhaiti.org), a New Hampshire-based nonprofit whose mission is to feed, educate and employ communities in north Haiti, hosted its 7th Annual Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) MobilePack™ on Saturday, May 20, at Seacoast Helicopters in Portsmouth, NH.

The daylong food-packing event brought together over 600 volunteers to hand-package over 130,000 FMSC MannaPack™ meals, which are specially formulated to provide protein, carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals to severely malnourished children. These meals are now en route to north Haiti, where they will feed 500 children in two schools throughout the 2017-2018 school year.

Over the last seven years, Help for Haiti has provided nearly 1.4 million meals to impoverished children in Haiti. Jim Willey, Help for Haiti founder and president, said, “We could not fulfill our mission without the 600 volunteers that join us at the foodpack, year after year. By donating their time and energy for just a few short hours, they are guaranteeing that every child we support in Haiti will be provided a hot meal - every day - for an entire school year. For this, we are incredibly grateful.”

This year’s volunteers also provided generous donations to help pay for the meals and their transport to Haiti, which costs roughly 30 cents per meal. To learn more or donate to the cause, visit www.helpforhaiti.com.
